BLISSFIELD- Carol Ann Burgermeister, 82, of Blissfield, died Wednesday evening, September 2, 2020, at Blissfield Place. She was born October 31, 1937, at home, in Deerfield, to George and Marjorie Wandt (Raitz) Crunkilton.

Carol graduated from Deerfield High School in 1955, she then attended Eastern Michigan University where she earned a Master's Degree in Education.
