ADRIAN – Dorcas Mae (Shepherd) Baughey, 85, of Adrian, Michigan passed away on November 15, 2020, with her family by her side.

Dorcas was born to the late Henry and Roseann Shepherd on December 25, 1934, in Floyd County, Kentucky. She is also survived by three sisters and one brother, Dennis and Ada Marvin of Adrian, Marie Cates of Adrian, Ken and Melba Moran of Adrian, Raymond, and Carolyn Shepherd of Adrian. Dorcas was also preceded in death by one sister and four brothers, Bella Pask, Mickey Shepherd, Butch Shepherd, Howard Shepherd and Junior Shepherd.

Dorcas married Donald R. Baughey, Jr., on April 2, 1950; and was united in marriage by the groom's father, the late Rev. Donald R. Baughey, Sr. They lived their lifetime together in Adrian. Together they created a family with love, understanding, firmness and a Christian upbringing. Dorcas is survived by her husband of 70 years; their four children, Jack and Mary Baughey of Bradenton, Florida, Daniel and Brenda (Baughey) Wright of Hudson, Gary R. and Jane Baughey of Adrian, and Bud and Dawn (Baughey)Lowe of Hudson. Dorcas is also survived by 17 grandchildren, 24 great grandchildren and 6 great-great grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by a grandson, Chad Baughey, Sr., and great-grandson, Justin Robertson.

Dorcas and her husband were the owners and operators of Superior Dry Cleaners in Adrian for 15 years; and they also owned and managed the Super Laundry Mat in Adrian for 12 years. Dorcas was a member of the Pilgrim Evangelistic Tabernacle Church in Adrian. She was a devoted Christian and taught Christian values to her children all her life.

Public visitation for Dorcas will be held on Friday, November 20, 2020, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Wagley Funeral Home in Adrian. A private funeral service will follow. A

graveside service will take place Friday at approximately 3:00 p.m. at Lenawee Hills Memorial Park.

You kept me safe & warm,comfort when I cried.,set your needs aside for me. Met me at my bed side every night to pray. I remember bed time Bible Book stories you read me. Bible story records, I loved to hear. I still have them, hard to part with! I remember how it was hard for you to come up with money to buy the next record in the set, yet you completed the whole set. A precious memory I cherish to this day. I watched as you & dad worked so hard for all we had early mornings to late night. I recall church every Sunday morning & night, Wednesday prayer & Camp meetings,revivals at our church & others.. Easter pieces, Christmas plays, character parts to memorize, creating sets for the play. Mom worked so hard to teach us the right way of life. She worked every day but Sunday. Sunday night after church I looked forward to a piece of french toast but we only had enough for each of us four kids to have one piece. Mom & Dad many times had none.

I'm older now with kids of my own, it was my turn to be a Mom. Boy I just had not realized how hard a job that is. Babies crying, losing sleep. Putting their needs before my own, .Struggles making the food bill stretch, new clothes for school, arguing with the teenager why they can't have gym shoes that cost over \$20.00. Hand me down clothes, sometimes to short, looked like hi waters hems on pants. Work full time while watching to keep them safe. Helping with school work now over my head, cleaning house, no nap. Christmas coming, need to work to provide. Keep a roof over our heads, keep bills all paid. two sick kids, I still must work. Mom and Dad was always there to catch me when I stumbled. They would walk in with diapers or groceries for the week. I always got a helping hand and not a hand out

Kids are older now, they are getting married, leaving the nest. I'm lost without them! Mom and Dad have gotten older and need more help. Soon Mom's health began to fail and Dad's has too. Mom started being hospitalized often and I just could not sit back and not help where ever I could. I could never leave her in the hospital alone and always spent the time by her side. As years have gone by her health kept getting worse.I could not walk away, This last year pretty much of it was spent with her needing care at home or taking her back to the hospital. She gradually became more and more dependent on fixing her meals, helping her dress, bath, getting her ready for bed at the end of the day. Cleaning the house, driving her to the doctor. She had become an amputee of her right leg and left toe. Now she needed round the clock care. I could not leave her. Now it was wheelchair, transport and lifts to get her around, I still could not leave her. Eight strokes later as I sat at the edge of her bed. Instead of setting at her bed side praying, I began to kneel at the foot of her bed at 9PM every night to pray I ask our church members and family to pray with me at 9PM every night. Because of her condition a monitor had been placed in her room. I had forgotten. Mom would watch the clock every night and say its 9PM time to pray. Soon Doctors & nurses came up to me I did not know, asking me if I was the one praying at the foot of my mothers bed? I said yes, they then said they to where meeting us in prayer at 9P every night and told me how that had changed them. I began to see God's plan. My life has come full circle. My mom took care of me helpless as I was and now I take care of her. She was so helpless and needed me. I read to her from the Bible while there. God used her life to witness at the end to others. By praying with me as she had always taught me, but now I was the one

kneeling at the foot of Mothers bed. Where Mom taught me to live my life and pray at the foot of my Mother's bed.
