A lover of animals, a passion for her German Heritage, a talented ability to play and sing music, an amazing ability to refurbish items others have cast aside and an extraordinary green thumb is just a minute glimpse of what made up the life of 90 year old Anna Marie (Stahl) Hofmann Yost who passed on from this world, Sunday December 26, 2010. Anna (Annie) started her life-journey at the home of her late parents, John Julius and Christiane (Blessing) Stahl in Toledo, OH, on July 12, 1920. Annie was the 7th of ten children. After attending Hopewell and Whitmer Schools and working at the Haas-Jordan Umbrella Factory, Annie married Harold Hofmann on May 30, 1942. Surviving is their daughter, Christine (Clifford) Buehrer. They also raised their surviving nephew, Robert C. (Judy) Stahl. Harold preceded her in death in 1959. In 1965, Anna married Charles Yost, who passed away in 1984. Charles (Kathryn) Stahl and John Julius Stahl II are her remaining brothers. Going before Anna, were siblings, Julia Hyter, Amelia Paulun, Paul, Frederick, William, Robert E. and Rudy Stahl.

In Annie's lifetime, as a musician, she taught guitar lessons at Spratt's Music Store, and privately in her home. Annie also refinished and caned furniture, was a Rural Mail Carrier, an ambitious member of the 'Happy Wanderer's Banjo Band', and boarded horses at her beloved farm.

Proudly, she was not your stereotypical knitting and baking Grandma. She left behind granddaughters, Stephanie (Justin) Ebert and Kristiane (Matthew)

Hubbard. In addition, she is survived by her great grandson, Glenn Ebert and Robert C. Stahl's children, Teri, Robert W. and Jay Stahl. Anna was a special person not to be forgotten by her extended family, friends, and neighbors.

A memorial service celebrating Anna's life will be held at a later date.
