ADRIAN – Earl L. Huyck, 95, of Adrian passed away Tuesday, March 22, 2011 in Grand Rapids surrounded by his family.

Earl and Maxine celebrated 66 years of marriage before she passed away in 2004. Earl worked for American Chain and Cable for 36 years, retiring in 1978.
