Herrmann, Frederick Howell "Rick" April 15, 1941 – February 15, 2016 of Ann Arbor, MI, a prominent architect, died peacefully on February 15, 2016 with his wife, Patricia (Trish) DeBoer at his side.

Born in Syracuse, New York and raised in Detroit, MI, he graduated from Cooley High School and went on to receive his formal education in the college of Architecture and Design of the University of Michigan.

As a private practitioner of the profession of Architecture, he pledged his talent, effort and devotion to the design and completion of buildings of the highest aesthetic and functional value – buildings which would become the revered possessions of their owners and users, and the pride of the community.

A memorial will be held at 2:00 p.m., Thursday, February 25, 2016, at the First Presbyterian Church of Ann Arbor with Rev. Melissa Anne Rogers officiating.
