ADRIAN – Herbert L. Rink, 91, of Adrian, passed away Sunday, November 6, 2011, at Lenawee Medical Care Facility.

He was born March 1, 1920, in Adrian, the son of Frank and Mary (LaGore) Rink. He graduated from Adrian High School with the Class of 1938, and received a bachelor's degree from Adrian College in 1942.

On March 6, 1942, Herbert married Virginia Wonder in Adrian. Herb and Virginia celebrated 54 years of marriage prior to her death in 1996.

Herb was a letter carrier for the US Postal Service for 30 years, retiring in 1979. He also worked part-time as a bookkeeper for Hurd Locke Company.

Herb was a 56 year member and an ordained Deacon of the First Presbyterian Church. For the past few years he lived at Grand Court, which he considered as his "home away from home". He was an avid Detroit Tiger fan and enjoyed watching The Lawrence Welk Show. Herb was a devoted friend and enjoyed visiting his friends in nursing homes as well as in their residences.

He is survived by his children: Barbara (Michael) Mohler of Adrian; Mary Ann (Terry) Fitzgerald of Orrville, OH; Susan Arbaugh of Toledo, OH; Stephen

(Clarice) Rink of Adrian; David (Gloria) Rink, also of Adrian; Thomas (Pamela) Rink of Tulsa, OK; Judy (Michael) Buckenmyer of Liberty Twp., OH; and Laura Rink of Royal Oak; 21 grandchildren; 21 great grandchildren; and two sisters, Vera Rink and Katherine Suydam, both of Adrian.

In addition to his wife, he was preceded in death by a son, James, and a brother, Donald.

A memorial celebration of Herb's life will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, November 11, 2011 at the First Presbyterian Church in Adrian with the Reverends James and Kathleen Splitt officiating.
