PALMYRA- Jacqueline Amelia Raymond, 84, of Palmyra, Michigan died Monday afternoon, December 19, 2022, at Lenawee Medical Care Facility. Born on April 21, 1938 in Easton, Pennsylvania, she was the only daughter of Walter and Irene (Allen) Adrian. Jacqueline graduated from Blissfield High School with the Class of 1957.

On May 11, 1957 Jacqueline married her high school sweetheart, Ronald Raymond, in Angola, IN; and they shared over 49 years together before his death on November 23, 2006.

Jacqueline worked in food services at Adrian College for over 18 years, retiring in 1996. Ronald and Jacqueline were members of the Irish Hills Antique Car Club and longtime members of Faith Baptist Church in Adrian. Jacqueline had a natural green thumb and enjoyed working in her vegetable and flower gardens. Jacqueline was preceded in death by her parents; husband, Ronald; and two

brothers, Harold and Larry Adrian.
