



## John P. Beaubien

February 3, 1947 - June 27, 2015

Dr. John Paul Beaubien, 68, of Manitou Beach, Michigan, passed away peacefully on June 27, 2015, in Toledo Hospital. John was born to Thomas and Betty Beaubien on February 3, 1947 in Monroe, Michigan.

John attended St. Mary's Grade School in Monroe, Michigan and, following elementary school, he entered Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit where he studied for the next eight years. John then realized God's call to the healing ministry and enrolled in Logan University in Chesterfield, Missouri where he graduated with a Doctor of Chiropractic degree.

He began practice in Adrian, Michigan, following his graduation from Logan University. His ongoing education in health, nutrition and wholistic living was of great benefit to his patients. His many patients over the years appreciated his caring manner and his gentle, healing hands as well as his keen sense of humor. John's gift for painting and his care for the environment and his love for his dogs, Stetson, Lucy and Oakley, will also be remembered.

In 2011 he received the Humanitarian Award from the Lenawee County NAACP for his support of youth education for African American students.

He was preceded in death by his parents and his life partner, Gary Geahlen. He is survived by his siblings: Gregory, Ronald, and Karen as well as by many
