ADRIAN – Lewis S. Stone, age 90 of Adrian, died in the presence of his family on Sunday, February 2, 2014, at the Hospice of Lenawee Home.

Born May 14, 1923, in Washington, D.C., he was the oldest child of the late Lewis and Margaret (Cutler) Stone, Sr.

Lewis served in the Navy during World War II. He was the Editor-in-Chief of The Daily Collegian at Penn State University where he earned both a Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Chemistry.

He married Janice Breon on February 21, 1953.

In 1964 Lewis moved his family to Adrian to work as a technical writer at Stauffer Chemical Company. Lewis was a faithful member of the First United Methodist Church.

In addition to Jan, his wife of almost 61 years, he is survived by their children: Karen Stone of Phoenix, AZ; Linda (Rick) Ridley of Ann Arbor; Michelle Rion of Adrian; Judy (Randall Downer) Stone of China, Maine; and Rev. Eric (Sherry) Stone of Essexville, MI; four grandchildren, seven step grandchildren, several great grandchildren, and siblings: Phyllis Mack of Florida; Cynthia Nelson of Virginia; and Milton (Caryl) Stone of Minnesota.

Besides his parents, Lew was preceded in death by a brother, Walker Stone and son-in-law, Nicholas Rion.
