ADRIAN – Lois R. Langley, age 72 of Adrian, passed away Saturday, May 31, 2014, at the Hospice of Lenawee, Hospice Home.

Born August 18, 1941, in Charleston, West Virginia, she was the only child of Glenmore and Anna (Bowers) Rice. After graduating from Frederick High School in 1959, she attended Towson University in Baltimore where she earned a Bachelor's Degree, and she later went on to earn a Master's Degree from Western Michigan University.

On May 20, 1967, Lois married Richard Langley in Frederick, Maryland, and he survives.

Lois taught 4th grade for many years in both Maryland and Battle Creek, Michigan. She was a substitute teacher after moving to Adrian in 1984. Lois became a licensed realtor and worked for Re/Max, Edward Surovell Realtors, and most recently, for Linda Rudd and Associates.

An active member of the First United Methodist Church of Adrian, Lois was a member of the Rebekah Circle and past president of United Methodist Women. She was also a member of the Bixby Auxiliary, KKE, and past president of PEO. Lois enjoyed flower gardening and arranging, and was a long time member of the Garden Club.

In addition to Richard, her husband of 47 years, she is survived by their children: Stephanie Langley of Marion, OH; Richard (Dianna) Langley, Jr. of Palm Harbor, FL; Jeffrey (Kim) Langley of Adrian; and Scott (Katie) Langley of Clarkston, MI; grandchildren: Sheryl (Cyrus), Alexander, Joshua, Zachary, Jordan, Megan, and David; and great grandchildren, Demetri and Gavin.
