Adrian—Dr. Robert “Dr. Bob” Roberts, 76, of Adrian, passed away at his home on Tuesday, February 26, 2013, under the loving care of his family and Hospice of Lenawee.

He was born September 4, 1936, in Huntington, NY to Ann (Garns) and Robert Roberts. He graduated from the University of Iowa with a Doctorate in clinical psychology.
