ADRIAN – Ruth M. Schoonover, age 93 of Adrian, passed away Monday, August 25, 2014 at Charlotte Stephenson Manor.

Born July 28, 1921 in Wauseon, Ohio, she was one of the 14 children of Sidney and Bertha (Apple) Shipman. After graduating from Fulton Centralized High School, she went on to earn a Bachelor's Degree from Central Missouri State and a Master's Degree from Michigan State University.

On November 28, 1940, Ruth was married to Rev. Modie Schoonover in Wauseon, Ohio, and they were blessed with 64 years of marriage.

Ruth retired from Madison Schools where she taught business courses for many years. She was a member of the First Church of the Nazarene. She was also a member of the Michigan Education Association.

She is survived by her siblings: June Balentine of Indiana; Marjory Clark of Florida; Freda Morgan of Hastings, MI; Don Shipman and Philip Shipman, both of Delta, OH; and numerous nieces and nephews.

In addition to her husband, Modie, Ruth was preceded in death by brothers, Vernon, Alva, Alvin, Sidney and Marvin Shipman; and sisters, Dorothy Elton, Betty Hazlett, and Phyllis Mock.

Before I started taking typing classes I was told my fingers were too small and I could never do a good job. With the great teaching I had from Mrs. Schoonover and her not giving up on me, I excelled in this class. In the end, I was given a pin for typing the most words in a minute (with 3 or less mistakes, that was a golden rule 😊) than anyone had done before. I recall saying back in high school my perfect job would be if I typed all day.
