SAND CREEK - Our beloved mother, grandmother, sister and friend, Thelma Frances (Baugh) DeLine left our arms to be with her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on January 2, 2015 at the age of 85.

Thelma was born February 13, 1929 on “the home place” in Fairfield Township, the seventh of eleven children of Ellis Adelaide Richeson and Lewis Deo Baugh. On September 18, 1949 she was united in marriage to Rev. John Hiram DeLine and they celebrated 62 years of marriage before John went to “Glory” on May 20, 2012. She was Pastor DeLine’s faithful supporter and helpmeet as he pastored four local churches. Currently, she was a member of Reformed Baptist Church of Lenawee.
