Vesta began her teaching career in one room schoolhouses in 1947. She retired from Summerfield Elementary School in 1994, having taught for 47 years. After retiring, Vesta traveled extensively throughout Europe touring castles. She was an avid fan of the Detroit Tigers and Pistons. She also enjoyed flower gardening and bird watching. Vesta attended Bethany Assembly of God Church.
