



Virginia Eloise Webb

January 23, 1919 - July 19, 2015

BLISSFIELD – Virginia “Eloise” Webb, 95, entered Glory on July 19, 2015 at the home and in the presence of her daughter, son-in-law and granddaughter in Blissfield MI.

Eloise was born on January 23, 1919, the 2nd of 6 children to Odessa (Dinkins) and Harry Bess of Desloge, Missouri. About 1922 the family moved to Detroit, MI, where Eloise graduated from Western High School and 1 year of business school. On June 1, 1940 she and Ellsworth R. Webb married at Stanton Park Baptist Church. In 1950 they moved from Detroit to Lincoln Park MI and then to Adrian MI in 1976. Following retirement they spent 3 winters in Arizona. In August 1979, Ellsworth died after 39 years of marriage.

Eloise returned to employment as a nurse’s aide at Maria Hall, assistant to her son, Dr. E. Russell Webb and then as a foster grandparent at Porter Center in Adrian, MI.

In addition to her parents and husband, Eloise was preceded in death by sisters June, Ruth and Alice and brother Robert. Surviving is sister Phyllis of Novia Scotia, Canada, son Dr. Russell Webb of Mountain Home, Arkansas, daughters Marcia (Steve) Bowman of Modesto, CA and Virginia (Troy) Smith of Blissfield, MI. Also surviving are 13 grandchildren, 27 great-grandchildren and 3 great-great grandchildren.
